Napa Cabernet Sauvignons from veteran producers such as Lewis, Cade and Tor stand tall here, while Oregon Pinot Noirs from Eminent Domaine, Purple Hands and Archery Summit impress with vibrancy and richness. Steely Chardonnays from Burgundy's Chablis region offer refinement and mouthwatering flavor. The latest releases of E. Guigal's acclaimed "La-La" Rhône reds are here. Vibrant and rich, offering complex savory cherry and pepper notes that play against a loamy minerality as this flows toward refined tannins on the finish. Drink now through 2023. –*T.F.*

Pinot Noir Dundee Hills Stoller Vineyard 2015 94 points | \$50 | 600 cases made | Red

Supple, expressive and vibrant, with rose petal, raspberry and stony mineral aromas and elegantly layered flavors that glide sleekly toward a refined finish. Drink now through 2023. –*T.F.*
